Part-time Instructors Diploma in Accounting (DAP)

The Sauder School of Business at the University of British Columbia is seeking applicants for Part-time Instructor positions, teaching various courses in the Diploma in Accounting Program (DAP) beginning May 1, 2020.

Qualifications:

- A Professional Accounting Designation (CPA) is required, preferably combined with a Masters level degree in Business, or related fields,
- Demonstrated knowledge of theories, understanding of applications and extensive public practice and/or business-related in one or more of the topic areas covered by the core courses in DAP
- Proven ability to instruct in face to face classroom, blended and on-line teaching environments as evidenced by strong teaching evaluations
- Demonstrated ability using learning management systems, classroom technologies and innovative pedagogical approaches to create engaging adult learning experiences,
- Demonstrated ability to work collaboratively with other instructors and staff.

Responsibilities: The position will focus primarily on teaching courses in the Diploma in Accounting Program. Other administrative duties include: liaising with faculty members to prepare syllabus and materials, holding office hours, participation in meetings and course related administrative activities. We also expect the candidate to engage in professional development.
